Zachary C. Schauf is a litigator in the firm's Energy and Appellate and Supreme Court practices who helps clients resolve their most difficult legal problems, particularly in highly regulated industries and in complex commercial disputes. He has been the primary author of winning appellate briefs and critical motions in courts nationwide, from the United States Supreme Court and federal appellate courts, to state trial courts, to administrative agencies. An experienced oral advocate, Mr. Schauf has prevailed in every appeal and dispositive motion that he has argued.

Mr. Schauf has particular experience in the energy sector. When Exelon agreed to a \$6.8 billion merger with Pepco Holdings, Mr. Schauf defeated attempts to block the merger and successfully defended the merger's approval on appeal. In Illinois, New York and the District of Columbia, Mr. Schauf has defended innovative clean energy programs and infrastructure initiatives against constitutional challenges. Energy clients also turn to Mr. Schauf to represent them in complex multi-forum disputes—when high-stakes matters dictate litigating simultaneously before the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, state administrative agencies, and state and federal courts.

Clients in other highly regulated industries also rely on Mr. Schauf's advocacy. In financial services, Mr. Schauf was the primary author of winning Supreme Court briefs in *Kokesh v. SEC*, which dramatically limited the SEC's power to pursue stale claims. In the communications sector, Mr. Schauf has advised clients facing aggressive FCC enforcement actions on potential statutory and constitutional challenges. And in the Indian law realm, Mr. Schauf has represented Indian tribes before the Department of Interior, before state and federal trial and appellate courts, and before the US Supreme Court, on issues including sovereign immunity, federal preemption, tribal leadership, gaming rights, and reservation status. Because of his expertise, Mr. Schauf was an invited speaker at the Federal Bar Association's Indian Law conference.

In complex commercial cases, Mr. Schauf has erased billions of dollars in potential liability for clients in the financial services, hospitality, and automotive industries. Mr. Schauf has litigated a slew of mortgage-backed securities cases, securing dismissal of a breach-of-contract lawsuit seeking \$500 million in damages and eliminating hundreds of millions of dollars in potential liability on the eve of trial with a successful *Daubert* motion, among other victories. Mr. Schauf has also obtained the reversal on appeal of multiple adverse jury verdicts, and prevailed against consumer class actions via motions to dismiss, oppositions to class certification, summary judgment motions, and on appeal.

Mr. Schauf maintains an active pro bono practice. He has helped a father obtain discretionary relief from removal to Haiti, secured the release from prison of a criminal defendant whose sentence was unlawful, and prevailed on behalf of a Wisconsin resident who was subject to a stop-and-frisk that violated the Fourth Amendment. In the Supreme Court, Mr. Schauf has represented Arizona's independent redistricting commission, a capital defendant challenging his death sentence, and individuals facing abusive government forfeitures, among others. In Mr. Schauf's *amicus* practice, he has advocated on behalf of
